# **Weddings at Prescot Parish Church St. Mary The Blessed Virgin)**

We are delighted that you wish your marriage to take place at Prescot Parish Church. We hope that your Wedding Service will be a joyful occasion and we will do our best to make it so. The information in this booklet will help you in your planning. Please feel free to contact us if you have any queries.

## **Legal Requirements**

It is necessary that one of you lives within the parish of Prescot, or have a connection with the church (i.e. been baptised here) or is registered on the Church Electoral Roll. Those outside the parish with no connection with the church or parish must have worshipped with us regularly for six months before they can be entered on the roll.

**The Banns of Marriage** have to be called here on three Sundays within a three month period before the wedding. If one of you lives in another parish, the banns must be called there as well; you arrange this with the vicar of that church. A Certificate of Banns (there is a free for this) will be given to you; this must be given to us before your wedding can take place.

## **Religious Requirements**

It is usual for one or both of you to have been baptised as a Christian, although neither of you needs to belong to the Church of England.

## **Form of Service**

The Marriage Service in normal use is “Common Worship 2000”.

## **Music**

Please arrange to meet our organist, he is always in church on Sunday mornings at 11.15am, following the Eucharist. Please give some thought what hymns you would like. Some suggestions can be found in the Wedding Music section at the back of this booklet.

## **Choir**

If you wish, It may be possible for the choir to sing at your wedding. There is an additional charge for the choir. It is unlikely that the choir will be available during the school holidays.

## **Bells**

If you request it early enough it may be possible for the church bells to be rung. There is an additional charge for Saturdays and week days.
